

CBA helps ensure success of future Capital Projects at GCWW

CBA initially began working with GCWW during 2001 as a result of our history (now 30 years) of guiding public and private organizations engaged in mission-critical capital projects in project management and project controls best practices. GCWW engaged CBA in answer to a full-scale review of project management software and services to fulfill their requirements for managing capital projects. CBA has been regularly involved with GCWW since 2001 and has provided software and software implementation services for users within the Planning, Engineering Design, Construction Contract Management and Information Technology organizations. Since 2001, GCWW has utilized Primavera P6 EPPM for scheduling projects in support of its capital programs, which include new construction, replacement / rehabilitation of aging infrastructure, and support of state, county and various city street improvement projects. Projects include work within the water treatment plants, general building facilities, as well as, storage tanks, and the regional transmission and distribution water main system.

Services provided included core team training, review of existing project management procedures, project management maturity assessment, implementation consulting, project template development, process and procedure development, integration with the Cincinnati Financial System (CFS) & PeopleSoft, standard and custom report development, end user and administrative desk quide development, training and mentoring. A project management steering committee was formed as a result of the efforts. The decision to utilize project management software was driven from the top of the organization by the Director of the Department and the Chief Engineer. Over the course of the CBA's thirteen-year business relationship with GCWW, 8 different CBA employees provided, sales, consulting, process development, training and software integration services. Principle Engineer for the GCWW, Mark Raffenberg said, "CBA has been an irreplaceable asset in helping GCWW raise the bar for capital project planning and truly a trusted resource for all our project needs.

Today, Greater Cincinnati Water Works plans out its portfolio of future capital projects through the year 2025 at a high level using project level budgets and project specific metrics such as linear feet, pipe size and street name / cross street name extents. Multi-year active projects are managed at a moderate level of detail depicting a plan, design, procure, construct, closeout life cycle with costs associated with Design and Construction activities.
